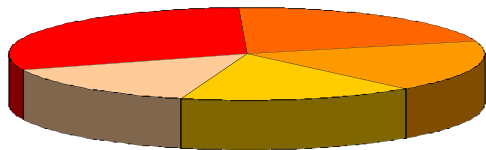
Critical Community Needs

When donors give through Maui United Way, they are investing in our community safety net. This investment helps to create change in the lives of people who need help by allowing our partner agencies to provide access to many of the community's most critically needed services. These needs were established through a partnership with Maui United Way and the County of Maui

Each year our partner agencies apply for grants from the community fund. To determine the allocation of these funds dedicated community volunteers and business leaders meet with our partner agencies to assess their needs, review their grant request and ensure that agencies adhere to sound fiscal policies and invest contributions in programs that help our community. Community Fund donations are then allocated to partner agencies providing services in critical community need areas.

Maui's Critical Needs Areas

- 30% Meeting Basic Community Needs, Preventing & Treating Substance Abuse
- 21% Nurturing & Developing Our Youth
- 18% Caring For Our Kupuna & Disabled
- 16% Strengthening Our Families
- 15% Promoting Health Education



Results You Can See

Emergency Assistance

- Women Helping Women provided a total of 8,313 bed nights. That's 23 people per day at the shelter. Their Domestic Violence Hotline received a number of 32 calls per day with 6 of those callers in crisis of domestic violence.



- Community Clinic of Maui saw 3,623 uninsured patients, providing over \$900,000 in income-based sliding fee discounts.

Nurturing and Developing Our Youth

- Boy Scouts of America had 976 youth participating in their social, daytime and after school programs and activities.

Maui Family YMCA provided 25,241 individuals with Health Education and programs.

Strengthening Our Families

- Mediation Services of Maui served over 690 cases and 1409 participants with mediation orders from the justice system.
- Maui Family Support Services Early Identification staff members met with over 1600 new parents providing information and referrals to various programs through the Healthy Start program.

Promoting Education & Healthy Living

- American Red Cross provided health and safety courses including disaster preparedness education, to over 1,477 community members this past year.

- American Heart Association, Maui Division, reached over 13,600 people in Maui County through health fairs and events. Health fairs offer educational material, blood pressure checks, stroke assessments and CPR education/training.

Caring for our Kupuna and Disabled

- Maui Adult Day Care Centers provided 258 elderly adults with quality day care this past year.

- Imua Family Services served 2,450 clients in 2008. Children through age five received occupational therapy, physical therapy, speech language therapy and special instruction services.

Meeting Basic Community Needs, Preventing & Treating Substance Abuse

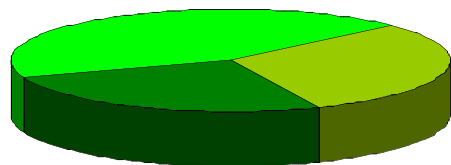
- Ohana Makamae provided help for over 119 clients with intensive outpatient treatment for chemical addiction and provided their families with education of having a supporting role in the addiction recovery process.

- Aloha House, Inc. provided behavioral health programs, including substance abuse and mental health treatment, resulting in 70% success in members this past year.

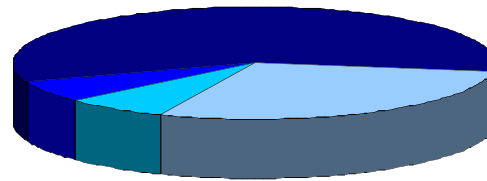
Community Fund
